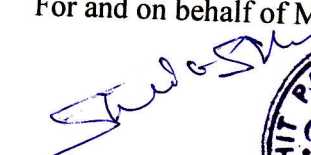

Following a decision taken by the Union Home Ministry, Thakur was given compulsory retirement on March 23 in "public interest". He was "not found fit to be retained for the remaining tenure of his service", an order from the Union Home Ministry had said of Thakur, who would have completed his service in 2028.

"In the public interest, Amitabh Thakur is being given premature retirement before completion of his service with immediate effect," the order had said.

Flood brings miseries to denizens, exposes administrative lacune

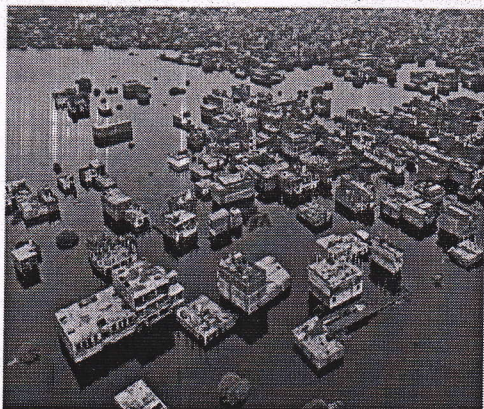

The recent flood that badly hit the denizens of Prayagraj, the erstwhile Allahabad, brought to the fore, the shortages and sufferings of people residing in low lying areas around the town, and forcing the flood affected people out of their homes and hearths.

Besides, the flood also exposed the administrative lacunas and unpreparedness of the city and the district administration that always wakes up late to help the needy people, when water situation gets worsened and reach over the head, despite the knowledge that the flood hits Allahabad almost every year due to high rise in water level of both Ganga and Yamuna and their tributaries in Uttar Pradesh and neighbouring provinces like Madhya Pradesh.

Although, city and district administration swung into action and relief and rescue operation was launched in the flood affected area around the town by involving government agencies and non-governmental organisations, and local politicians including political and social workers, MPs, MLAs and ministers, however, the crises of the flood affected people was far from over, until the water level in both Ganga and Yamuna rivers and their tributaries started receding.



and subsided on their own. Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad maurya, and cabinet minister Nand Kishore Nandi both conducted aerial surveys to gauge the suffering of the people and took the stock of the ground situation of the affected areas and instructed City and district administration authorities to provide immediate relief and rescue the affected people.

However, keeping in view the number of the flood affected people, for whom some shelters were arranged by establishing some makeshift camps at government schools and other establishments, the relief and rescue operation remained insufficient and quite scarce, in both quality and quantity, the flood affected people alleged, and deplored.

Even, the basic relief materials like water bottles, biscuits and food packets were quite insufficient, and scarce, the suffering people further rued.

The flood situation had stood worsened in Allahabad for more than week, where almost all areas on the Ganga and Yamuna rivers banks in Naini, Chhatnaag, and Phaphamau remained submerged under river water.



The problem was further added by the main tributary in the region Tams river flowing through Meja area. The district administration along with the NDRF teams visited several flood affected areas and distributed essential food items like food packets, biscuits, chips, milk and potable bottled water besides ration as well as some shelter and areas, officials said.

Cabinet minister Siddhartha Singh, divisional commissioner Sanjay Kumar Goel, district magistrate Sanjay Kumar Khatri, and municipal commissioner Ravi Ranjan, accompanied by other senior officials from district and city administration, visited several flood hit areas in Naini, Phaphamau and Chhatnaag areas and distributed relief materials to the affected residents.

Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad maurya also conducted an aerial survey of the flood affected area in both Ganga and Yamuna river bank in Naini, Chhatnaag and Phaphamau. He later held a meeting with districts and city administration officials and also instructed them to rush the relief materials and rescue the stranded people to shift them to safer places. In the town.

Even the inner circle of Allahabad town that remained submerged and narrowed for more than a week included areas like Bada Baghda, Chhota Baghda, Badra, Samauri, Allahpur, Daragram, Naagvasuki, Kairahana, Bahughat, Gausnagar, JK Ashiana, Baradasti, parts of Karchhaghat, all located near Yamuna Bank, in the south, besides, Telarganj, Mehndadi, Chandpur Salari, Drapadi Ghat, Ganga Nagar, Nevala, Bili Cagan, and parts of Ashok Nagar, and Rajapur in the north besides Phaphamau and Jhusi, etc.

The flood affected people in the low lying area had sleepless nights, with water levels rising persistently in both Ganga and Yamuna rivers at alarming pace.

Besides, fresh spell of heavy rainfall downpour added to the woes of the residents who were stranded in different parts of the affected areas.

The flood relief camps which were temporary makeshift shelter points were set up by the district and city administration, for providing relief materials to the people.

The national disaster relief force was also pressed into service and deployed in many flood affected areas to carry out relief and rescue operations.

"I have seen the extensive damages that the flood has carried out on the denizens and their properties, and have instructed the district and city administration officials to keep providing all the necessary help that the flood hit people need," said deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad maurya, while talking to media persons, at Circuit House in the town.

Meanwhile, the health department was tasked to remain prepared for carrying out extensive drive to tackle any challenge emerging out of the continued flood situation in respect of outbreak of any diseases or pandemic in flood affected areas around the town and remain on high alert.

Meanwhile, with the flood situation worsening, the memories of previous floods in Allahabad like, in 2016, 2013, and that of the 1978 floods flashed across the minds of the people and the city residents, and haunted them back.

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9 more bodies recovered, toll rises to 23 in Kinnaur mishap

Nine more bodies were recovered under the debris of the massive landslide, at Nugalseri in Kinnaur district in the last 48 hours, raising death toll to 23. However, it is said that seven or ten others are still untraceable.

A massive landslide had occurred on Wednesday here, burying half dozen of vehicles including a HRTC bus and some other vehicles in the mishap few days ago from where 13 people were rescued from under the debris.

Deputy Commissioner of Kinnaur Abhishek Sankh said that rescue operation began at 06:00 hrs again on Saturday and six more bodies recovered, while three bodies were recovered last day. Total 23 bodies have been recovered and 13 injured were treated in the mishap.

The land slide and shooting stones wreak havoc at Nugalseri area of Nichear Subdivision in Kinnaur district in the morning of Aug 11 as one Himachal Pradesh Roadways bus, two cars, one passenger vehicle (Tata Sumo) and one truck buried under the debris. A Balero Camper (SUVE) and its passengers are not still untraceable. It is possible that the vehicle might have rolled down with the debris.

So far, as many as 23 dead bodies have been recovered from the incident site so far, seven passengers of HRTC bus, who have been identified also missing and untraceable in the mishap.

Raghuveer Narayan renounced title of Special Magistrate for freedom struggle

The village of Asauda has played an important role in preparing the revolutionaries for the freedom for Independence of India.

Many freedom fighters of the country has started their journey from here. This village Asauda has first begun was blown to intensify the flame of revolution.

Under the British rule, the area of Asauda Daub used to get much higher rent than Asauda. The Zamindar Rai Bahadur Chaudhary Devi Singh was one of the prominent Zamindars of Uttar Pradesh. Chaudhary Raghuveer Narayan, son of Chaudhary Devi Singh, was made a Special Magistrate by the British Government in 1931. He gave the title of Rai Sahib at 14. But he renounced the title of magistrate and Rait Sahib in 1934 and worked as a revolutionary.

Chaudhary Raghuveer Narayan was now one of the main associates of Gandhiji. Chaudhary Raghuveer Narayan had more influence in the area. To whom Gandhi came and appealed for co-operation. A meeting was organized outside the ancient palace of village Asauda.

In which thousands of people from the villages heard the thoughts of Gandhiji, besides the revolutionary Chaudhary Raghuveer Narayan of Asauda, Lajpoot, Raghuveer Narayan, Harprasad Singh, Kanwar Sain, Mohammad Anil Khan, Sheorath Singh Pandit Laladhar Vishwanath of Hapur, Lal Singh Prasad, Lal Singh, and hundreds of other people including Mukund and editor and Minister Sahai Bimal were involved.

On the voice of Chaudhary Raghuveer Narayan Singh, a large number of young revolutionaries from the villages came forward and jumped into the battlefield of freedom of India Independence.

On 6 April 1930, a strategy was made to break the Salt Law. At the same time, on 13 April 1930, it was announced to break the Salt Law in the Haldwar River.

At the same time, Chaudhary Raghuveer Narayan took the Satyagrahis along with him to break the salt law. And Kail reached Meerut via Khurkhoda and the batches set out to break the salt law.

Hundreds of youths from Meerut College left their studies and came to the camp to become revolutionaries.

Arrived at Himmatnagar and on 14 April 1930 broke the salt law and made salt. In which Chaudhary Raghuveer Narayan was arrested. After this Pandit Laladhar Vishwanath went for the first time to break the salt law. Whom the police could not catch.
